

This is another winner for a very talented author. I had know knowledge of what took place in Ukraine during World War II. Spradin somehow takes the Holocaust one the largest stains on humanity, and manages to both pay tribute to its victims yet at the same time, leave the reader with a sense of hope. The duel between Anton and Major von Dueseon is tense and suspenseful and just when I thought I had things figured out they went in a completely different direction. I highly recommend this book, not just for middle grade readers but for anyone with an interest in World War II, history, the Holocaust or if you just want to read a ripping good adventure yarn.
