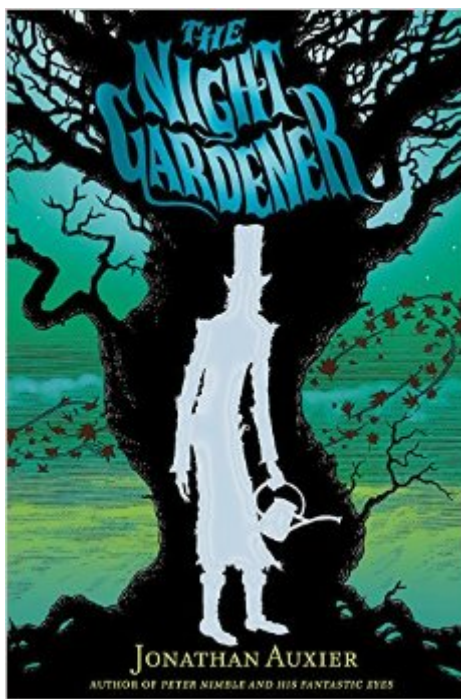

Every now and again when we get really lucky, we encounter a story that reminds us why thereâ€™s nothing in the world that compares to finishing a really good book. For a reading teacher itâ€™s an essential reminder that we must do more than deliver skills to kids. We need our students to experience what itâ€™s like to lose themselves in a story. It is with the utmost reverence that I express how Jonathan Auxierâ€™s forthcoming title, *The Night Gardener* has captured the very essence of a good storyâ€™s power. Itâ€™s a tale so ethereal, it made the world around me feel two dimensional in comparison. Plenty of great books keep you entertained from the first page to the last. For me, the mark of an exceptional book is how much I remember about it weeks, months, even years after Iâ€™ve finished. Itâ€™s been six months and I can still feel the story. I can picture Constanceâ€™s ring falling off of her finger and the need to put the book down for a moment so I could take in how the action of a ring hitting the floor could evoke such terror. The deep pride I felt for Molly, who could take an ordinary button, what little she has to her possession, and transformed it into a sense of security for her brother. And Kip, whoâ€™s cheery, confident, and courageous demeanor preserved Mollyâ€™s true north. Itâ€™s not just the world, and characters, and tone of the book that still resonates. With its suspenseful spookiness, vivid world, endearing characters, and expert pacing, my hunch is that this is a book that will inspire the same feelings for many, many kids. Iâ€™m thankful for *The Night Gardener*. Itâ€™s a story that helps us see the person that we are and the person we want to become more clear.

For whatever reason, 2014 is a dark year in childrenâ€™s middle grade fiction. I speak from experience. Fantasy in particular has been steeped in a kind of thoughtful darkness, from *The Glass Sentence* and *The Thicket* to *The Riverman* and *Twelve Minutes to Midnight* with varying levels of success. And though none would contest the fact that they are creepy, only Jonathan Auxierâ€™s *The Night Gardener* has had the chutzpah to actually write, "A Scary Story" on its title pages as a kind of thoughtful dare. A relatively new middle grade author, still young in the field, reading this book itâ€™s hard to reconcile it with Auxier's previous novel *Peter Nimble and His Fantastic Eyes*. It is almost as if Mr. Auxier took his whimsy, pulled out a long sharp stick, and stabbed it repeatedly in the heart and left it to die in the snow so as to give us a sublimely horrific little novel. Long story

short this novel is Little Shop of Horrors meets The Secret Garden. I hope I'm not giving too much away by saying that. Even if I am, I regret nothing. Here we have a book that ostensibly gives us an old-fashioned tale worthy of Edgar Allan Poe, but that steeps it in a serious and thought provoking discussion of the roles of both lies and stories when you're facing difficulties in your life. Madcap brilliant. Molly and Kip are driving a fish cart, pulled by a horse named Galileo, to their deaths. That's what everyone's been telling them anyway. Living without parents, Molly sees herself as her brother's guardian and is intent upon finding a safe place for the both of them. When she's hired to work as a servant at the mysterious Windsor estate she thinks the job might be too good to be true. Indeed, the place (located deep in something called "the sour woods") is a decrepit old mansion falling apart at the seams.
